

Plans for the 2020 Reunion in Newport, RI are nearing completion. We will be staying at the Mainstay Hotel and Conference Center located at 151 Admiral Kalbfus Road in Newport, RI. It is 5 minutes from the Main Gate at Newport Naval Station. The Hotel has space for us to do all of the routine things our reunions involve. We have chosen OCT 6-9, 2020 for the reunion dates. [Tues-Fri] This is mid-week so the cost of a room is much less. Also means we will have the Naval Base Staff available to assist with base activities. We will be visiting the Naval War College (NWC), the NWC museum and the Surface Warfare training facilities with lunch at the Officer's Club overlooking Narragansett Bay. Our memorial will be aboard the USS Massachusetts which is moored at Battleship Cove in Fall River, MA. The USS Joseph P Kennedy and the submarine USS Lionfish are also in the Cove! Go to <a href="www.battleshipcove.org">www.battleshipcove.org</a> to get the full picture. The hotel is next to Newport, so we can shuttle you to many things and places Newport has to offer. We will have the local tour company (most likely Viking)

available to take you on tours of Newport and/or visiting the mansions. Side excursions might include the Whaling Museum in New Bedford; vineyard tours on and off Aquidneck Island; a 3 ½ mile stroll on Newport's Cliff Walk; Fort Adams State Park; Green Animals Topiary Garden; the Tennis Hall of Fame; the White Horse Tavern (oldest operating restaurant in the USA); the Newport Car Museum in Portsmouth, RI; and you can eat out in any of the hundreds of local eateries in Newport County. Google Newport to get a sense of what's available. You might consider Boston as an extension to your Newport visit. If you haven't been to the Boston area, it is loaded with historical attractions; USS Constitution; the Mayflower; Plimoth Plantation; and the list goes on! If there is something you would like the Reunion Committee to consider making available in the Newport area, please let us know.

PRESIDENT'S CORNER Since the last 21MC was published, we have made substantial progress in the mandatory Federal & State regulatory conversion process. We were notified on 7/27/2019 by the IRS that we are now officially a 501 (c) 7 non-profit, tax exempt Veteran's Social Group. After that notification, the Calendar Year (CY) 2018 informal audit package was prepared & finished & sent off to our Independent Financial Reviewer/Informal Auditor, Mike Stockreiter, who has the package for action per IRS Rules, Regulations & Guidelines (IRS RR&G's). His Independent Financial Review/Informal Auditor report to all membership will be in the next 21 MC per IRS RR&G's. As IRS RR&G's now require, we have to report ongoing financial status to membership! The last 21 MC reported \$8,593 in USS TURNER REUNION GROUP (TJRG) funds as of 12/31/18. The next administrative chore will be to smooth up & FINALIZE the USS TJRG Bylaws & Guidelines. We can then register with State of Washington Secretary of State for State Non-profit status, required by law. With our famous ship as a destroyer museum in Bremerton, WA run by the 501 (c) 3 nonprofit, tax exempt Bremerton Historic Ship's Association (BHSA), we are locked into a certain course of State LEGAL & administrative action. My staff and I hope this Federal and State conversion process will be fully complete by the end of the year, barring unforeseen difficulties. Thus far, we are on schedule!


#### DONATIONS:


VETERANS REGULATORY INFORMATION UPDATE-Blue Water Navy Veterans are NOW entitled to a presumption of service connection for conditions related to Agent Orange. The extension of the presumption is a result of Public Law 116-23, the Blue Water Navy Vietnam Veterans Act of 2019, signed into law By President Donald J. Trump on June 25, 2019. The law takes effect on January 1, 2020. January 27, 1973 Just below the Qua Viet River SYN




Figure 1527a. Elements of the celestial sphere. The celestial horizon is the primary great circle.

CDR Robert Brock McClinton USN, later RADM USN(Ret), onboard May 65 to OCT 66 as Commanding Officer and Mrs. Gunvor McClinton. Our beloved Bob McClinton, age 94 passed away in his sleep on April 12, 2019 and his beloved wife, Gunvor passed away on June 8th, 2019. Bob was a consummate Surface Warfare Line Naval Officer, USNA graduate (class of 1947), also commanded the USS Detroit (AOE-4), retired from the US

Navy in 1982. He was an avid cyclist who rode from the Pacific Ocean to the Atlantic Ocean at age 69 to raise funds for cancer research, a certified flight instructor for single engine planes and a master yachtsman. MM3 Charles E. Swalla passed away July 3<sup>rd</sup>, 2019 in San Antonio, TX. Onboard from 1965 to 1967. He leaves behind his beloved wife Sue, daughter Jana and her husband and 2 Grandchildren. He was a 1972 graduate of Lea College in Albert Lea, MN. He is Interned in Porter, TX.

EM2 Charles A. Diskin, passed away July 9, 2017. Later EMC USN(Ret). Onboard 1966 to 1969. Leaves behind a daughter, Denice. From Post Falls, ID. No Internment information was given.

BT1 Willie Johnson, reported passed away, date unknown, by BTC Ray Berube USN(Ret). Onboard circa 1971 to 1975. He was originally from Texarkana, TX. No family and NO Internment information was given
